Transportation:

By Car

The Aquarium is located at [1 Central Wharf](#), near the Marriott Hotel, close to Faneuil Hall/Quincy Market.

[Parking options](#) for the Aquarium include validated parking, non-validated parking and [bus parking](#). If you want to park your car and take public transportation the rest of the way, inexpensive parking is available at major MBTA stations around Boston.

By Subway/Train

The closest subway stop is just 100 yards from the Aquarium. It is the Aquarium stop on [MBTA's Blue Line](#). All other subway lines connect to the Blue Line, and stops off all of the lines are only a short walk from the Aquarium, including the State stop on the Orange Line (8-minute walk), the Government Center stop on the Green Line (10-minute walk), and the South Station stop on the Red Line (10-15-minute walk).
